

## **COUNCIL UTILITIES REGULATORY OFFICER**

### **NEW ORLEANS CITY COUNCIL**

The New Orleans City Council is the legislative branch of New Orleans city government. The Council considers and enacts all local laws that govern the city of New Orleans. The Council also approves the operating and capital budgets for the City, as recommended by the mayor, and continually monitors revenues and expenditures for local government operations. The City Council is also the regulatory body for public utilities, cable and telecommunications companies, and oversees the operations of the public access television in Orleans Parish.

The City Council is comprised of five districts and two councilmembers-at-large. Council President and Council-member-at-Large Jacquelyn Brechtel Clarkson; Council Vice-President and Councilmember-at-Large Eric Graderson; District "A" Councilmember Susan Guidry; District "B" Councilmember Stacy S. Head; District "C" Councilmember Kristin Gisleson Palmer; District "D" Councilmember Cynthia Hedge-Morrell; and District "E" Councilmember Jon D. Johnson.

The City Council is seeking a qualified individual with legal and utility regulatory experience to manage and administer the operations and affairs of the Council's Utility Regulatory Office, build the necessary staff, and recommend ways to increase the office's capacity for cost savings and advancement of progressive policies. The Council Utilities Regulatory Officer (CURO) is the staff advisor to the Council on all policy and franchise authority matters related to its regulatory responsibilities, who will provide direction and management of in-house staff, as well as the legal and technical consultants retained by the Council. The CURO acts as the liaison between the Council and other regulatory agencies, as well as elected officials. The CURO will also act as legal advisor in regulatory litigation matters.
